Lab Tracker

In Our Laboratory *Each and Every Day* Donors Help Provide the Safest and Highest-Quality Care

The Hospital’s Laboratory receives 50 new patient specimen cases each day.

Many are from patients who are having colonoscopies. Others come from patients who undergo a biopsy to rule-in or out disease, perhaps breast or prostate cancer. Still other samples come from patients in our ORs.

Each sample goes through a complex process that ends with the pathologist analyzing a slide or multiple slides and coming up with a diagnosis that is reported back to the patient’s physician. Many people are involved – a pathology sample changes hands often.

Thankfully, a brand new donor-funded Anatomical Pathology Tracking System is now in place, automating this intricate, manual process.

This computerized system generates a 2D barcode on cassettes, glass slides and specimen labels. At each point of handling, new computer hardware is used by technologists to scan the

2D barcode on the sample, ensuring proper patient identification.

Karen Scales, the Hospital’s Charge Technologist in the Anatomical Pathology Department says, “This tracking system helps protect patients from the serious risk associated with sample misidentification.”

New Monitors/Defibrillators Help Caregivers Provide Best Patient Outcomes

Critically ill patients are sometimes at risk of a heart attack due to the stress of their illness.

A crucial piece of equipment to keep these patients safe while at Guelph General Hospital is the monitor/defibrillator. This can be rapidly accessed in the event of a sudden heart failure and is an integral component of crash carts within areas such as the Bob Ireland Family Intensive Care Unit, Linamar Emergency Department and Operating Rooms.

For patients whose heart stops beating, the monitor/defibrillator is a critical piece of equipment. It is used in tandem with CPR to provide the best outcome. It can save a life.

Guelph General has a "Rapid Response" protocol where dedicated staff intervene early when a patient is not doing well. Matching this up with the latest resuscitation technology could quite literally be the difference between life and death for our most critically ill patients.



Monitor/Defibrillator

New monitor/defibrillators offer many benefits that drastically improve resuscitation success rates. One new feature is that they give instant feedback to the person(s) performing CPR, which ensures CPR is being performed optimally.

The Hospital needs to replace a total of 16 monitor/defibrillator units. Thankfully we are a little over halfway to meeting our \$240,000 goal due to partial funding from this year's Black Tie Bingo.

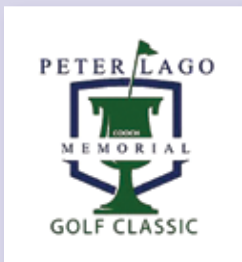


Stone Road Mall's 5th Annual Children's Charity Golf Tournament

Seeing More Clearly

Cataracts are the most common cause of vision loss in people over age 40 and are the principal cause of blindness in the world. Guelph General Hospital performs over 1,600 cataract surgeries a year. With the addition of a new state-of-the-art microscope, thanks to a donation from the Lions Club of Guelph, ophthalmologists now have the best possible clarity while they operate on a patient's eyes.

"This new microscope offers our ophthalmic surgeons the optimal visualization so they can operate with the highest precision during surgery," says Guelph ophthalmologist, Dr. Robert Johnson. "It drastically improves our visual field, optics and illumination, providing outstanding image quality throughout each step of the procedure."

The donation was a natural fit for the local Lions Club according to President Jim Sanders. "In 1925 Helen Keller challenged Lions to become "knights of the blind". Since then, we have done just that," he says. "The Lions Club of Guelph as its centenary project is proud to once again support the Guelph General Hospital's ongoing provision of medical eye care to residents of Guelph and surrounding area."

The new microscope is a great example of how community support can improve the high quality care the Hospital is able to provide explains Suzanne Bone, CEO of The Foundation of Guelph General Hospital. "Thousands of local community members will benefit thanks to the vision of the Lions Club of Guelph. Their generosity is so very much appreciated."

It's a Wrap!

Last summer we received almost \$4.3 million from the provincial Health Infrastructure Renewal Fund (HIRF) to be used to keep our facilities in a state of good repair. That work has just been completed. Topping a very long list of needed repairs were: replacing numerous roof surfaces on four buildings, replacing crumbling bricks on exterior walls, recaulking many windows, and excavating and waterproofing a portion of the tunnel that joins the Hospital to 73 Delhi.

Reporting To You

What a Difference You Have Made

In our last fiscal year, which ended on March 31, thanks to donors like you, Guelph General Hospital was able to purchase more than \$2 million in urgently-needed equipment it would not otherwise have been able to afford. In fact, more than one of every two dollars spent by the Hospital on equipment last year came from a donor.

The Hospital's President and CEO, Marianne Walker, says, "Each day at Guelph General Hospital, lives are changed and often the equipment purchased through the generosity of our donors plays a role. Donors have a direct, positive impact on the care we're able to provide."

We transferred a total of \$2,023,283, which funded well over 100 items. Some of the larger items included the Hospital's three new ultrasound machines, specialized surgical equipment used for joint and hip surgeries, and new technology that connects vital signs monitors directly to patient records.

Some small yet important purchases included a nitrous oxide system for the Family Birthing Unit so that women giving birth now have another pain management option available to them. And, for a very small price tag of \$91.70, the Hospital was able to purchase storybooks that help children understand death.

Funds were raised through generous donations for specific projects, 13 bequests, mailings, memorials and events like Black Tie Bingo and Tour de Guelph.

The Foundation's CEO, Suzanne Bone, sums it up: "We are so grateful for our most generous community. Donations large and small combine to have an incredible impact on our patients and the care we are able to provide. We are blessed by their support."
