

Monitor/Defibrillator Units and Portable X-ray Machines Update

Dr. Lin is thankful for the incredible difference that donors make to care givers and, more importantly, to every patient at the Hospital. The loss of a patient is devastating for a family. And it weighs heavily on a physician. It matters to have the right piece of equipment at the right time.

Our community has demonstrated its generosity and commitment to exceptional patient care time and again. This year is no exception as we saw the caring response to help fund emergency and critical patient care equipment including new monitor/defibrillator units for all of Guelph General as well as two portable X-ray machines.

Participation in events such as **Black Tie Bingo** and **Fore Our Hospital**, along with the response to our mailings, email and other appeals helped raise needed funds for these vital pieces of equipment.

Already we are seeing the impact the funds are having at GGH. Seven specialized monitor/defibrillators arrived in August.

Back in May we told you a startling story about Gavin, a man in his early fifties who woke up one spring morning with an odd feeling in his chest. Thinking it was just heartburn, he went to work. Over the day his discomfort intensified. After work, he decided to go to the Emergency Department where he collapsed and died right in front of the attending emergency physician, Dr. Lin. Promptly, a monitor/defibrillator was used to deliver an electrical shock to Gavin's heart and then he was given cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

Gavin survived!

Situations like this play out all the time at Guelph General Hospital. Almost every day in our Hospital, doctors provide emergency treatment to patients like Gavin who are in cardiac arrest or acute respiratory distress.

Cole Sanders was only 14-hours-old when the reporters started arriving at Guelph General Hospital on Saturday, July 1. He had a good cry at one point, but mom, Christina Sanders, quieted him under a most spectacular quilt designed and hand-stitched by Guelph quilter, Cheryl MacDonald.

Cheryl created the beautiful, one-of-kind, Canada-themed quilt and donated it to The Foundation of Guelph General Hospital. Her only request was that it be presented to the first baby born on Canada's 150th birthday. Cole was born one hour after midnight.

Cole's parents said they would treasure and take special care of the quilt. The two-sided quilt is alive with iconic Canadian images including a map, native animals, and maple leaves. The border includes the signatures of living past and present Canadian prime ministers.

Suzanne Bone, CEO of The Foundation of Guelph General Hospital, called MacDonald's gesture extraordinary. "It is simply amazing that someone would spend this many hours to create a gift for

We used our portion of the funds to purchase two non-invasive respiratory ventilators.

Our own Suzanne Bone, Heritage Society member and Foundation CEO, hosted the luncheon and was delighted to highlight a recent, remarkable estate gift that helped fund the purchase of 300 wireless IV pumps. Kim Towes, GGH's Clinical Director Inpatient Surgery, told us how these pumps help nurses provide better care for patients throughout the Hospital and shared staff's appreciation.

Dr. Ian Digby, GGH's Chief of Emergency Medicine, engaged the crowd with a lively talk about the Emergency Department – when to go, what to expect, what to bring and what's next in our plans to serve the community. The good news is our Emergency Department is well staffed and considered a model of success. However, the large increase in visits coupled with more complex patient needs has put additional pressure on our Emergency Department and wait times. To help, we're planning for an Emergency Department expansion that will provide more space to help us manage 63,000 visits per year.

Hospital Happenings

Accreditation: It's one thing to believe we are providing safe and high quality care, but it's another thing when judged by highly-rated healthcare professionals from outside the organization. Our viewpoint was validated when we received "Accreditation with Exemplary Status" from Accreditation Canada – an independent, not-for-profit organization that sets standards for quality and safety in health care. Only one in five healthcare providers that go through the accreditation process receives this top award, which is given to "organizations that go beyond the requirements of Accreditation Canada and demonstrate excellence in quality improvement."

A three-member accrediting team spent three days at GGH in May, visiting almost every area of the hospital and interviewing staff, patients, families and community healthcare partners. In the end, we are proud to say GGH met or exceeded 98.3% of the 2,233 standards that were assessed.

Hospital joins with local association to provide hope to new stroke patients

Linking Survivors With Survivors is a March of Dimes Canada program. It's a peer support program that provides hope and encouragement to stroke survivors and their families. The program's specially-trained volunteers are now coming into hospital settings and GGH is the first in our area. Before, those meetings usually happened only after a patient had been discharged from hospital.

So far, it's been a great success, says Barbara Moore from March of Dimes Canada. She credits the great teamwork they've experienced with the Hospital. She also has nothing but praise for her volunteers who go through a lengthy training process before becoming a peer-to-peer mentor.

It's been very well received by Hospital staff and a huge benefit to stroke patients, says Deb Hastings, Director of the Stroke Unit. "It is helpful for the patients to hear from someone who has been there and shared the same story. It is very supportive and provides that light at the end of the tunnel for patients and families as they adjust to their new normal in stroke recovery."

A second dog, Bella, and her mom, Beth, have now joined Layla and Charlotte, bringing more *pawsitivity* to our Hospital.

“The doctors and nurses at Guelph General now have the most cutting edge equipment available to manage cardiac arrest because of your generous donations,” says a grateful Dr. Lin.

The Foundation is continuing to secure funds for the remaining defibrillator units and the two X-ray machines. Gifts of Gratitude, Monthly Giving, Tribute Gifts, and other gifts that were made without designation will also be allocated to this need until the full goal is reached.

The sooner the fundraising goal is reached, the sooner the Hospital can purchase the remaining pieces of equipment so, as Dr. Lin says “the physicians at our Hospital can do the very best possible job at saving lives.”
